10 Things to Know About Sex Trafficking

- 1. Sex trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery in which a commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud or coercion, or in which the person is induced to perform such an act is under age 18.
- 2. Traffickers use psychological as well as physical coercion and abuse.
- 3. Victims of sex trafficking can be women or men, girls or boys, but the majority are women and girls.
- 4. Traffickers often lure victims into situations of sex trafficking by promising a good job, good money or other luxuries.
- 5. Victims can be sold into the sex trade by parents, husbands, boyfriends, others. Some victims are kidnapped.
- 6. Sex traffickers often "condition" their victims with starvation, confinement, beatings, physical abuse, rape, gang rape, threats of violence to the victim or the victim's family, forced drug use and/or threat of shaming their victims by revealing their activities to their family and their families' friends.
- 7. Teenagers are especially vulnerable to becoming victims of sex trafficking.
- 8. Victims may suffer from traumatic bonding, a form of coercive control in which the perpetrator instills in the victim fear, as well as gratitude, for being allowed to live.
- 9. There are many forms of sex trafficking, such as forced or coerced prostitution, pornography, stripping, live-sex shows, mail-order brides, and sex tourism.
- 10. Sex trafficking can occur in high-profile venues, such as street prostitution, or in underground systems, such as closed brothels or homes.
