Position: Human Trafficking Program and Housing Coordinator

Reports to Director of Anti-Human Trafficking

Position Summary: The Human Trafficking Program and Housing Coordinator (Coordinator) is charged with leading various projects to enhance the overall work at the Human Trafficking Drop-In Center and improve the quality of services for Human Trafficking survivors. The Coordinator ensures that team members have administrative/programmatic support to be effective in their role. The Coordinator will provide trauma-informed crisis support. This position will be an active member of the Human Trafficking Multidisciplinary team.

The Coordinator will provide appropriate and compassionate care in a safe, clean, and welcoming environment. This position will coordinate all housing needs for any guest at the Human Trafficking Drop- In Center. The Coordinator will also be the liaison between guests and their case management team, and collaborate with other departments in the agency to ensure sustainability and safety in client recovery.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

- Lead various projects to enhance the work at the Human Trafficking Drop-In Center.
- Provide support and technical assistance to the Human Trafficking team.
- Coordinates transportation for psychoeducational workshops held at Human Trafficking Drop- In Center.
- Communication liaison between advocates, case management, therapeutic services, and community partners.
- Ensure that case management services and appropriate referrals (shelter, food, ID, birth certificate, etc.) are provided to all guests at Human Trafficking Drop- In Center.
- Will maintain the confidentiality of the clients at all times.
- Assisting clients with applying for, locating, and obtaining safe housing for both shortterm and long-term needs.
- Knowledge of federal, state, and local housing laws.
- Assist guests in advocating for safe and fair housing and provide education on tenant and landlord rights, fair housing laws, and reporting procedures.
- Assist guests with housing applications.
- Develop relationships with landlords, Metropolitan Housing Authorities, and other community stakeholders that will improve access and sustainability of safe housing for survivors.
- Network closely with other agency staff for service coordination and development of efficient and effective referral procedures to meet client's various needs.
- Participate in ongoing Supervision and Professional Development opportunities.
- Attend and participate in departmental, organization-wide, and other meetings.
- Perform other duties as needed or directed.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree, two (2) years of full-time (or the equivalent of full-time) experience providing housing and case management services to the community in a criminal justice, human services or community-based program.
- Ability to demonstrate experience in project management and coordination; demonstrate fairness and sound judgment; demonstrate ability to adequately engage with guests, while prioritizing multiple and simultaneous requests for services.
- Ability to assess client needs and demonstrate ability to identify appropriate initial response plans; to remain calm and reassuring in crises and to intervene appropriately.
- Must have ability to build relationships, collaborate internally and externally, and
 demonstrated knowledge of cultural diversity and working with a wide variety of
 populations, staff, volunteers and partners both verbally and in writing; able to assess the
 needs of clients under emotional stress and refer to the appropriate resource, handle
 graphic accounts of crimes, interact effectively with emotionally upset survivors.
- Maintain confidentiality of information; Must be able to travel in North East Ohio and have a valid driver's license. Must have reliable transportation.

Hours of Work: The Coordinator role is a full-time position (40-hours a week) requiring flexible hours of work to meet the need of survivors of human trafficking. Evenings and weekend hours are required. This position is located at the Human Trafficking Drop-In Center. Hours preferred 10 am - 6 pm.
